D-Star Presentation at Next Meeting—Monday Nov. 8

Dave Hubbell- N2KTO will travel from New Jersey for Monday's meeting to deliver a presentation on D-Star operation. Digital Smart Technologies in Amateur Radio (D-STAR) is a digital voice and data protocol, and is one of the first on-air and packet-based standards that is designed specifically for amateur service use.

Dave will explain D-Star's capabilities and demonstrate how a D-Star network runs, For those who say there's nothing new in amateur radio, this presentation on D-Star should be a good example of how hams keep up with the latest technologies.

Thanks to the Warren County Amateur Radio Club for arranging this program. They'll be attending, too.

ATTENTION REPEATER USERS

The INPUT for the 147.000 repeater is changing from -600 kHz to +600 kHz.

Please reset your 2-meter radios to transmit on 147.600 to access the .00 repeater. On most, that's a simple selection of positive offset instead of negative. This will match our 147.240 repeater and most 147.000 repeaters around the



country. <u>P/L tone on both repeaters will remain the same at 91.5 Hz</u>.

The repeater has had reduced sensitivity for some time, and Jim K2LM, discovered why on a recent trip up Spruce Mtn. There's so much new stuff up there in conjunction with the county's all-new communications system, there's now a much higher level of local interference at the site. Some of it sits directly on the 147.400 kHz input frequency, effectively de-sensing our receiver. The new input frequency, 147.600, is much quieter and should result in much improved operation as a 60/00 repeater.

Jim ran into trouble retuning the oscillator on Spruce Mtn, and has to replace a component before the change, now scheduled for later in the coming week..





Board of Directors Meeting Oct 11, 2010

Meeting convened at 6:33 pm.

- No treasurer's report (no treasurer at meeting)
- Peter reported that the club now has 124 current members the highest number in several years
- At the recommendation of Jim-K2LM, the board agreed to provide up to \$600 toward a new UHF repeater and handhelds for Saratoga County Fairground. This will be on a commercial frequency and Jim will help facilitate. The board recognizes the willingness of fairground director to continue to offer us a rock-bottom rental rate for our September Hamfest. N2LUD will secure an FCC license for the fairground.
- K2LM reported that Frank-KA2QYE will be setting up a D-Star repeater at the site of his existing repeater. Board agreed to assist by covering costs of air card required for Internet connection at \$48/month for 12 months.

- Fred-W2EMS announced upcoming Mohawk Towpath Duathlon and asked for volunteers


The capacity crowd at the general meeting was treated to a great presentation by Ward Neal, KC2QKA. Ward spoke on alternate communications systems being implemented by the NYS Department of Health. He demonstrated WinLink 2000 and Air Mail, over HF frequencies assigned to Military Auxiliary Radio System (MARS).

The demonstration was hampered by some interference problems we're experiencing on HF at the Wilton EMS HQ. Local QRM generated by electronics and computer equipment in the building creates a very high noise level on receive. On transmit, our signal gets into the local PA System used throughout the building.

Probably the only was to overcome these problems is to move our HF dipole off the tower and farther away from the building. Volunteers?

The January meeting — (Jan 10) Not only do we want to keep the winter doldrums at bay, we want the club members to have fun with ham radio! Solar Update

Last week's report in the ARRL letter said: "Although this week saw a high daily sunspot number of 74 on October 26, the average sunspot number for the week dropped more than five points to 50.3. One new sunspot group, numbered 1119, emerged this week, but 1117 -- which has been visible since October 19 -- has become huge."

This is certainly an improvement over all those years when there were NO sunspots to report. Signal strengths are rising. DX is rolling in. Time to get on HF!


