

The Northern District ARES meeting was held in Clifton Park on July 20th, 2013. Saratoga County was represented by W2EMS and KC2YLM. Topics discussed during the meeting included the increasing use of the online database, the Section wide traffic net which are held on the fourth Tuesday of the month. Even numbered months are scheduled on VHF, Odd numbered months are scheduled to have an HF net. HF nets starts on 3.993 + or -, and the VHF net is on 147.300 PL 114.8.

Dave KM2O stressed the importance of continuing efforts to increase public awareness and professionalism for ARES.

# Boy Scouts Fall Camporee October 5<sup>th</sup> - Tim Kemp N2MBX

The Boy Scouts are going camping again. Not a big surprise, they go camping all the time. This time it is the Fall Camporee and it is a Council wide event. There are 8 Districts in the Twin Rivers Council, so for this Camporee, there will be over 1000 Scouts in attendance. Once again I am going portable with my station to expose as many Scouts to Amateur Radio as possible. I am a Radio Merit Badge Counselor and I often feel like the Maytag Repairman, no one calls me about the Merit Badge. To create interest, I will be setting up several stations to operate and hand out information about the Radio Merit Badge. I am going to need some help doing this. During the Fall Camporee, the Scouts travel around camp exploring the venues set up regarding different activities. Radio will be one of the venues. I will be camping out on Friday night to set up the shelter and tables, but everyone else could just show up Saturday morning.

# Taking an exam at the September Hamfest

What do you need to bring with you? Two forms of ID. One can be your driver's license, and one can be your ham license. There are many different things that are valid. A library card is OK, even a piece of mail with your address on it is OK.

Bring a copy of your Ham License. When you pass the exam, the examiners will need to forward that to the ARRL with your form 605. If you passed a previous test that the FCC has not acted upon yet, (maybe you passed General last week, and now want to take Extra but you don't have your General license yet), bring your CSCE and a copy of that also.

Bring a pen and pencil. You need a pen to fill out the Form 605, and a pencil with a good eraser to fill out the bubble answer sheet.

Oh, and one last thing, bring the proper fee. At the present time, its \$15. A check is OK.
