General membership meeting-October 14, 2013

The meeting topic of the evening was solar power for the ham shack. In spite of the holiday, (or maybe because of it), the meeting was well attended. Tim, N2MBX and Peter, W2BEW were the presenters.

Tim started out with a block diagram of a typical ham radio solar installation. Solar cells, are connected through a charge controller which in turn feeds the load applied. The load being a set of deep cycle batteries, and the ham radio station. Tim displayed some of his equipment, including his unique design for mounting the cells to a wooded frame which can be made to adjust the angle of the cells to the sun, which is necessary to harvest the maximum amount of energy from the sun. He also demonstrated the operation of his charge controller, and also various sets of cables he created to allow the placement of the cells various distances from the controller. This is to allow a very flexible emergency setup in the field.

Peter also brought along parts of his setup for display, and you can see some attached photos of his setup at home. He also brought along his unique solar cell mounting hardware. At home Peter has his collector mounted more or less permanently on a fence in his backyard. His mount is also manually operated for azimuth and elevation. Both Tim and Peter indicated that the position of the cells are fairly flexible, meaning that you don't need to be constantly running out to adjust the angles just to follow the sun.

It was emphasized that the cost of an installation is constantly going down as the technology matures, and some real bargains can be found if you shop around. Peter's emphasis was on the home installation, whereas Tim was more interested in field operations, demonstrating that the ham spirit of experimentation is not dead in the Saratoga area.

The next general membership meeting will be held on Monday November 11, 2013. The primary topic of discussion is expected to be Remote operation of a ham station via the internet. Steve WA2TPP has been using this capability for several years, as he regularly makes trips out of state.





A front view of Peter's Solar Cell. Its loosely mounted to his fence at home.



A rear view of Peter's installation, showing it genius flexibility. Note that is it mounted in a fence post to allow a wide degree of azimuth adjustment. You can just see the set screw in the PVC sitting on top of the fence post, preventing the cell from falling inside the post. Also note the U bolts hold-ing the frame of the cell to the horizontal PVC mounting. They are used to adjust the elevation. Peter says that he rarely makes any elevation adjustments, as the solar cell works well over a wide range of settings.
